

PRE HISTORY 1872-1963 (Compiled by Mrs Jenny Rabl)

The story of Catholic Education in Murtoa goes back long before the establishment of Our Lady Help of Christians School in 1963. Generations of dedicated catechists, priests and visiting nuns, not forgetting devoted parents instructed the children of the Church, preparing them for First Communion, Confession and Confirmation.

Mr Brock from the Railways was a catechist remembered by one of our senior parishioners. "He was a stern man, but a good teacher." Dorrie Turvey, later a Poor Clare nun, and Anastasia Pollard (Mrs Tooley) were other early catechists.

Mention would have to be made of Sophie Rabl's record of 50 years service as catechist to several generations of children, and her unswerving resolution to seeing that they knew and understood the basics of their faith. Her instruction was thorough and sound, and many who received lessons from her, and then went on to Catholic Secondary Schools found they were not disadvantaged. Others received all their teaching from Miss Rabl and their own parents, and were faithful Catholics all their days. For years the children were questioned on their catechism at Mass — at least 15 minutes was devoted to this by the priest every Sunday. Embarrassed parents listened to their nervous offspring stammer through their answers. I think this ceased about the early 1950's and later two of the nuns from Horsham came out and spent time with the children after early Mass, while the priest went on to Rupanyup.

PRELIMINARIES

Talk of a Catholic School for Murtoa had been tossed around for many years. Father John Day had ideas in that direction around 1950, but no definite move was made. Then about 1955, Father Dan O'Connell suggested the possibility and a rough survey of numbers began. The Catholic Women's Social Guild (League) commenced raising money towards the School Building Fund.

About 1961, when Father Lynch was Parish Priest, Bishop O'Collins directed that the hour was at hand and a committee under the chairmanship of Father Pat King commenced the preliminary discussions and plans. John O'Halloran (SEC Manager) was secretary, Bert Grigg was treasurer – ex officio and other committee members were Kath Delahunty, Jenny Rabl, Jack Delahunty for Murtoa, and Mary Jess and Michael Murphy representing Rupanyup.

LETTERS RECEIVED

On May 5th 1961 this very important letter was received:

Brigidine Convent High Street Malvern S.E.

Reverend P King S.S. Michael & John's Roberts Avenue Horsham.

Dear Reverend Father,

I have received your letter of the 27th April.

Reverend Mother General has given her permission for two sisters to travel to Murtoa from Horsham each day.

I hereby promise to send these nuns to Murtoa in February 1963. I am sure their transport will be arranged. I am happy to be able to give this pleasure to all concerned.

Now firm plans could be made. The site for the school has been given by Mr. And Mrs. J.F. Delahunty some years before and had been set aside for a new church as well as a school. The land had been subdivided into housing blocks in the early 1920's when it was expected that the development of the freezing works would see a demand for housing. This did not eventuate and the land remained a paddock.

BEGINNING THE SCHOOL

In July 1961 Father King sent the map of Murtoa to Mr R Appleford, architect, of East Camberwell and a School plan was obtained through Father Shelly of the Catholic Education Office, Ballarat. The school was to be sited on the corner of Munro and Collins Street, and two more blocks to the west, fronting Munro Street were purchased from Mr A. Grantley of Koo Wee Rup, to complete the frontage of the site.


By September 1961 the school plan and specifications were approved and Perc Coutts of Horsham was the chosen builder. Masonry veneer was to be the finish for the school as the Bishop was impressed with the low maintenance of this material from which the Dunmunkle Shire Office had been constructed a few years previously.

The building made quite rapid progress through 1961 – 1962 and by May 1962 Father O'Hagan had arrived and was enquiring about Bishop O'Collin's return from the Second Vatican Council in order to set a date for the blessing and opening of the school. A tentative date was given – Sunday 13th January 1963, but in November Father O'Hagan was notified that the Bishop would not be available until mid March 1963.

Approval was given by the Shire Council for the closure of Smith Street, to the west of the school block, and this enabled the large sports area to be planned for.

Father O'Hagan and his committee were busy with the final details for the rest of the year, ordering desks, a sound system, air conditioners, and a car for the nuns and the foundation stone for the dedication. From Mrs Leopoldine Mimovich of Yarraville, Father ordered two carved wood crucifixes and a statue or Our Lady Help of Christians. The name of the school was Father's choice as under this title Our Lady is patroness of the Guild (C.W.L.).

The Guild at this stage and for a number of years acted as Mother's Club, and money was raised for many necessary extras for the school – a piano, television, sewing machine, library books, shelves and a duplicator. The mothers also decided on a uniform for the boys and girls, predominantly blue and grey with some maroon.



The 1962 roll call of prospective pupils for the school revealed: -

At this stage it was thought that the school might extend to Forms 1 and 2 with the library as an extra classroom, and some help from the High School, but this was never a practical possibility.

OPENING

On 14th January 1963 the approximate number to start school were: -

9 children	Prep	9 children	Grade 1

A total of 61 at most, with 53 being the eventual number

On January 2nd, Father O'Hagan had written to congratulate Mother Ethna of Traralgon on her appointment as Principal of the school. Various details of management were outlined, including the purchase of a car, and Father O'Hagan concluded:-

"I beg you to learn to drive and get your licence before you come to Murtoa. There will be little enough time for that here."

Mother Ethna and her assistant Mother de Porres were the first teachers – (all the Brigidine nuns were accorded the title of Mother at that time, and it became Sister a few years later).

School commenced early February 1963 and the official opening and blessings was performed by Bishop O'Collins on Sunday 24th March 1963 before a large gathering which included representatives of local government, other local churches, and a large contingent of Brigidine Sisters, resplendent in their traditional habits.

An extract from the "Dunmunkle Standard", March 1963 "Catholic school opens new era for Parish"

"Described by speakers as a beginning of a new era in the religious life of the parish, Murtoa's new Catholic school, "Our Lady Help of Christians", was blessed and officially opened last Sunday by the Bishop of Ballarat, the most Rev.J.P. O'Collins.

The attendance of approximately 400, included parliamentary and shire representatives, and many visitors from all parts of the diocese.

Addressing the gathering after the ceremony, His Lordship paid tribute to the people of Murtoa and district for their long struggle to establish the school here. He mentioned particularly the generosity of the Delahunty family who had contributed materially to assist the venture, and also those who had worked consistently over the years to bring the project to fruition.

Those who had drawn up the plans deserved special praise also, for the school was the most up-to- date he had ever seen, and the first to incorporate a refrigerated cooling system for the comfort of the sisters and pupils.

The setting up of Catholic schools was of paramount importance, for it was impossible to separate religious training from ordinary education, and this was not carried out in the State school, Bishop O'Collins declared.

He considered that as well as the basic instruction of today, the children must be trained in heart and mind to live their lives according to their faith.

"They should be taught to love God unto all eternity," he said.

This was done in Catholic schools, but not to the detriment of ordinary education, for there was never any criticism of their standard.

The schools were inspected regularly by Education Department inspectors, and they repeatedly stated that the standard was at least equal to that in State schools. If appeared now that at last some assistance would be forthcoming from the government.

"All we are asking for is justice, for we all pay taxes (both directly and indirectly) toward the cost of educating our children, and it is only fair that we receive back some money for our church schools," he said.

Bishop O'Collins said he was delighted to have the opportunity of opening the school, which had borne out the glowing reports of Murtoa people he had received from various priests stationed here.

This was also exemplified by the wonderful work of Miss Sophie Rabl, who had recently resigned as catechism teacher at the school.

From his examination of children for Confirmation, he considered there was none better skilled in inculcating the doctrine of Catholicism.

Big step forward

Chairman of proceedings was Rev.Fr. Dwyer, of Horsham, who said the opening of the school was a big step forward in the Catholic life of Murtoa. The people of the district must feel very proud of their achievement, he said.

Welcomes to the Bishop were extended by the Parish Priest (Rev. Fr. Lynch) and the Shire President (Cr. G.H. Hemphill), who said the new school must play a big part in the development of the Shire of Dunmunkle.

Continued support needed

An appeal for funds, to redeem the debt on the building was launched by Rev. Fr. John Kirby. The school was opened at the time of crisis in Catholic education, he declared. Some people thought help would soon be received from the Government for church schools, but others were of the opinion that there was still a long and bitter struggle ahead. At present, Catholic schools were penalised in a land of the free, where freedom of thought was taken as the accepted thing. "We are not asking for charity, concession or grants, but merely justice and sympathetic understanding." Fr. Kirby said. The school had been erected by the faith of the people of Murtoa and Rupanyup, and he urged a continuance of that faith.

He knew of the generosity of the people of the district, and he was sure that generosity would continue. Commending the appeal to all, he said the efforts to date had been blessed with success, but still remained to be done.

A collection taken up for the appeal received a ready response, more than £850 being contributed by those present.

At the conclusion of formalities, the official party was served afternoon tea in the library of the school and the school was opened for inspection."

School Advisory Council & Parents and Friends

Since the 50th anniversary of the school, a significant change has occurred in the way schools are governed. Our Lady's is now governed by Diocese of Ballarat Catholic Education Limited (DOBCEL), which oversees 63 schools across the Diocese of Ballarat. Belonging to this system of schools allows for Our Lady's to benefit from resources, staff, and experience beyond Murtoa and the Wimmera. It also ties us in to the wider educational work of the universal Church. The vision of DOBCEL, expressed in the statement below, speaks to the significance of our work in Catholic Education:

As partners in Catholic Education, open to God's presence, we pursue fullness of life for all.

The School Advisory Council still exists and plays an important part in the life of the school. Acting in an advisory capacity, the SAC brings the voice of parents and the community to the school, and gives feedback on works undertaken by the school. The Parents and Friends group also acts in this fashion, but focuses more on fundraising efforts, providing support for school functions, and bringing about opportunities for students. Both of these groups have been well supportive over the life of the school, and building projects, the development of the grounds, resources used in classrooms, and experiences offered to students, would have been impossible without the dedication of members from these bodies.

It is in keeping with the founding of Our Lady's that lay people predominantly provide the support necessary for a school to flourish. OLHC benefits greatly from the presence and prayers of the parish and assistant priests, no doubt, but are blessed further by the P&F and SAC. We look forward to another 60 years and more with these parent bodies, working in collaboration with the School and DOBCEL, seeking the best outcomes for students at Our Lady's.

A Word from the Principal, Chris McCumstie



It is a pleasure working with the students, staff and families at Our Lady Help of Christians School each day. When I first arrived at the school, in mid-2023, I was blown away by the school grounds. Here we had a school that had been well loved, over decades, by the whole community. Beautiful gardens, statues, religious icons, murals and playgrounds were situated all across the school, and these spaces made me happy, just as they make the community happy. Parents have told me that the reason they choose to send their children to Our Lady's is because they feel warm and welcome when they come on site. This happiness reminds me of G.K. Chesterton's wisdom: "The test of all happiness is gratitude." and I

Secondly, I thank the Brigidine nuns who staffed the school for the first decade and passed on the Brigidine charism. St Brigid's crosses, images, and poems are in many places around our school and would not be so if not for the help of these good women.

Thirdly, gratitude is owed to the staff and principals who make the core business of our school possible. Teaching and learning in the Catholic tradition does not happen by accident. Rather, it takes the tireless dedication of teachers and leaders to enact a vision and to teach not the curriculum, but the children! Special mention, I feel, must be made of Anne Newton and Veronica Slattery. Long serving leaders are able to build a culture and develop a school better than those who only spend a season or two in a place. Not wishing at all to diminish the hard work, love, knowledge and expertise of other teachers and staff, I feel that we all owe Veronica and Anne our heartfelt thanks for their role in our school's history. Our Lady's would not be what it is today without them, and we all enjoy the fruit of their hard work.

I am also personally indebted to Cathy Grace, from whom I took over last year. Cathy worked hard in our school, especially in the areas of learning and student well-being.

Finally, it is clear that the way Our Lady's began was the way it continued. Lay-men and women, namely the families who send their children to our school, have always worked in support of this initiative. Working bees, building projects, fundraising, resourcing, mentoring and volunteering are just a few of the many ways our families have built this community. We exist to offer families a faith-based education option in Murtoa, and those families who have chosen this option have always given back. Thank you.

As we gather for the 60th anniversary of the school, I am struck by the number of students who are second, or even third generation members of our school. Parents who attended our school send their children here. Grandparents who come to celebrate liturgies with us attended the school themselves. I am fortunate to have the opportunity to work with this community. May we all continue to work for our students, that they may flourish. And may God continue to bless Our Lady Help of Christians School.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Awakenings is the Religious Education curriculum used at Our Lady's. The curriculum is used in all the primary and secondary Catholic schools across the Ballarat Diocese. Religious Education is taught in the classrooms each day and Masses or Liturgies on special occasion days such as the school's feast day, Mother's Day, Father's Day, the Grade Six Graduation as well as opening the school year are wonderful opportunities for the children to participate in. The school cooperates with the sacramental program run by the St Paul VI Parish, Wimmera-Mallee. The assistant priest, together with the families who desire the sacraments for their children, work for several weeks together to prepare for each sacrament. This cooperation between the Church, the school, and the domestic church which is the home, ensures our students have the opportunity to receive the sacraments as they progress through their schooling.

BUILDING PROGRAMS

Since the year 2000, thanks to State and Federal Capital Grants, the school has increased its facilities to now include the multi-purpose room; an Art room (which was initially used as a classroom in 2004 to cater for the increased enrolments after the Lutheran School's closure); a Library/computer pod; new student and staff toilets; a Principal's office and a refurbished front entrance. These grants were provided to bring the school's facilities up to a satisfactory Government standard.

After many tries for another grant which were all unsuccessful, the school community decided to apply for a loan through the Diocesan Supplementary Capital Fund to upgrade the cracked and dangerous asphalt quadrangle and build a multi-function court suitable for basketball, netball, tennis and P.E. activities. This was achieved at the end of 2012.

Since these developments, the Art Room has been relocated for use at St Patrick's Nhill, as that school's population required a room for key learning, where OLHC used it as an art room. It was sad to see the room go in early 2024, but knowing that it provides essential space for Catholic education in the parish is a consolation. The space left by the art room's removal, opened up views of the resurfaced oval, the bush land beyond, and made it possible to install stylish colourful outdoor furniture for alternate learning spaces and a veggie patch.

Cathy Grace went to a great deal of effort to secure a capital grant for a new school building. Work will commence in October 2024 to remove the original school building, and a modular off-site build will be installed for use from January 2025. Again, it is sad to farewell the original building, but the grant that secured a new building, will hopefully secure Catholic education in Murtoa for decades to come. We are blessed to have a 60th anniversary before the removal of the original building, so that past students, friends, families and staff can farewell the place that meant so much to them.













COMMITTEES

1963 – 2003: For the first ten years the school was supported by a School Committee - mainly fathers - who attended to practical maintenance. When the school first opened there was a house on the property, west of the school occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Steve Lang and family. By 1966, the Langs had moved and the house was demolished, but each spring jonquils, bella donnas and bluebells still spring up along the fence line and around the empty paddock. The **C.W.L.** continued to act as the Mother's Club raising money through catering and street stalls and attending to Sister's requests.

In 1974 the **Parents and Friends Association** commenced as a separate body, although there was some overlapping of personnel. Mr. Geoff Coutts was the "School Secretary" on a voluntary basis, coordinating the school's finances from his home through the Parish Office in Horsham, while all the other office administration was handled by the Principal.

Then in 1979, in keeping with the Vatican Council directions, a **School Board** was formed, including in its make up representatives of other bodies in the church. The Board acted and continues to act as a governing and organising body for the School, establishing policies and working with the Principal and teachers to implement such policies. The inaugural Chairman was David Grigg, son of Bert Grigg. The Parents and Friends became the main fundraising body of the school and conducted such things as coffee mornings, race catering, street stalls, lamington drives, craft market stalls and Melbourne Cup Day lunches to raise money for the school. The Race catering has been a part of the agenda for the Parents and Friends for more than twenty years. A record in the Minute Book in 1982 recommends that the Lunch prices be changed from \$3.80 to \$4.00 for lunch and from 80c to \$1.00 for afternoon tea.

In 2003, the Parents and Friends are the sole caterers for six Murtoa race meetings a year and handle an income of around \$20,000 over the financial year. Race meetings and catering for functions in the multi-purpose room are the main fundraising events for this committee at the moment.

In March, 1983 it was decided at a Parents and Friends meeting to ask the Board to write to the Shire requesting speed bumps, bicycle paths, and lower speed limits along Munro Street outside the school.

2004 – 2013: The Parents and Friends Association continues to work extremely hard fundraising for the school. In 2012, the number of race meetings was reduced from six to two, so fundraising was and is being supplemented with catering and street stalls. This has made it possible to continue raising the \$20,000 a year that had previously been made from the six meetings.

The School Board had its name changed to a "School Advisory Council" in 2012. In its capacity as an advisory body to the Parish Priest and Principal, the Council provides a sounding board for financial matters and future development.

After much pressure on the Shire over a number of years, the school now has two school crossings, one of which is manned by staff. The speed limit near schools was changed to 40 kph by Government legislation and a pedestrian/bike path has been sealed on the north side of the road for the use of College students which has helped keep the students safe.

Thanks to an organisation called "Community Axis", the school has been fortunate in being able to offer positions for several clients over the last few years who have been able to work both inside the school as secretarial/teacher aide assistants or as garden maintenance

personnel. This has lessened the need for working bees considerably and has kept the grounds neat and tidy while allowing many extra projects to be added in the school yard.













SPORTING ACHIEVEMENTS

Our Lady Help of Christians has achieved some excellent results in the sporting arena. As part of the "Murtoa/Minyip District Athletic Sports" Competition, the school was the champion school in 1967, 1968, 1969, 1970, and 1971. This competition was between Jung, Minyip Green, Minyip Blue, Minyip White, Murtoa Brown, Murtoa Gold, Murtoa Red, and Coromby. When the smaller rural schools in the wider Dunmunkle area closed, (e.g. Burram, Lallat Plains, Coromby, Lubeck, etc) the competition changed its name to the Dunmunkle School Sports Association which includes the schools from Minyip, Rupanyup, Marnoo, Murtoa College and Our Lady's who compete each year for the Ken Daggett Memorial Shield. Our Lady's was successful in winning the shield in 2019, 2021,2022 and 2023.

A Dunmunkle Schools Football Competition and a Basketball Competition were also conducted around this time. In the final year that the football competition ran, 1967, Our Lady Help of Christians were the champions on our old school oval in the back paddock. The match was between Our Lady's and Rupanyup. The last remaining goal post from the set of goal posts on this oval now holds up the bird feeder outside the Senior Room and has a plaque recording the names of the team members on it. *Paul Young, Vincent Delahunty, John Cashill, Damien Rabl, Mark Delahunty, David Cashill, Geoffrey Tannock, Ian Young, Andrew Jess, Gary Keel, John Gerdtz, Bernard Fontana, John Murphy, David Delahunty, Christopher Payne and Kevin Payne.*

EVENT RECORDS

Since 1975, the record set by Christopher Delahunty for the seven year old Long Jump with a jump of 2.77 metres still stands.

Leonard Clark's 1995 record for the twelve year old boys Senior Discus with a throw of 26.85 mts also still stands.

Participation in sport has always been important throughout the school year. Students enjoy swimming at the Murtoa Pool in summer, learning stroke and water safety techniques. They can now play basketball, netball and tennis on the new multi-function court. A specialised PE Program called "Bluearth" is offered on a weekly basis and a sport segment is part of the weekly curriculum.

Senior students run in the Dunmunkle Cross Country event in April each year and during the Winter months may be chosen for the Dunmunkle Football and Netball teams for Lightning Premierships played against other clusters. AFL Football Clinics and Wheelchair Sport visitors are included in the sport opportunities.

AROUND THE GROUNDS

Over the last ten years Natimuk artist Melanie Obst and Murtoa artists Bev Buckley and Steve Monk have volunteered their time to beautify the school with murals, mosaics and sculptures. The students have helped with some of the art work which include murals, mosaic stepping stones and pavers.

The ship tree house was built with help from the Rupanyup-Minyip Bendigo Bank branch which gave the Student Action Team a grant of \$1,000.

A larger project undertaken by the students outside the school grounds was the building of the two Murtoa lizards which are on the median strips of Marma and Duncan streets with help from funds offered through Wimmera Uniting Care's "Student Youth Focused Service" and from artist Steve Monk. Steve designed and built the lizards out of Hebel brick for the students and they then covered the lizards with mosaic tiles. The community was invited to help with the project and two giant lizards promoting the name "Murtoa" (which means "Home of the Lizard" in the Indigenous Australian language) are prominent features in the town.

Since 1993, the school has been entering the Victorian Schools Garden Awards. Over this time the school has won five Regional awards and three Achievement awards. In 2012, the school was announced the State winner in Category One for schools with 100 pupils or less which was a major achievement.

Due to the budget restraints of a small school, all the projects achieved in and around the school have been funded either by the Parents and Friends or by grants from a variety of sources.

EXTRA CURRICULA ACTIVITIES

Teaching Farms

In 2006 and 2007, Our Lady's students took part in a "Teaching Farms" program. The school was partnered with Hobson's Bay Primary School near Williamstown in Melbourne and their first visit to Murtoa was in 2006, with staff and students being billeted with school farming families. They spent three days in the town experiencing country life. In 2007, Murtoa students were invited back to Hobson's Bay for a return visit to experience city life for three days.

Eco-Cubby Project



In 2009, the senior students took part in an "Eco-Cubby" Project. Through Environment Victoria, they were assigned two Melbourne architects who helped them design a "sustainable" house. The students decided to design a house made of car tyres which were in plentiful supply around the school because of tree planting started in 2000 to build a working track

in the paddock at the back of

the school. Tyres were recommended as tree guards at the time and around six hundred tyres were used to guard the trees from visiting rabbits. The exercise of designing the house was very beneficial in helping the children understand the aspects of sustainable building practices.



Visiting Presenters

Visitors to the school over the years have been author Michael Salmon, cartoonists Dave Gibbs, Richard Galbraith and Tony Sowersby. Olympic swimmer Lisa Curry visited and spoke to the children about living a healthy lifestyle and the value of exercise and Life-Saving Victoria has shown the students how to "resuscitate a mate", singer-songwriter Andrew Chinn recorded a video of his new piece "Mary's Song" with our students performing. Freestyle Dance Ministry, AFL Football Clinic and a golf clinic have also visited our school on multiple occasions.

Through the local CEP Cluster, the children experience performances over the course of the year which could be from dancers, puppet-shows, magicians, or musicians. Every chance is taken to widen the children's life experiences and provide learning opportunities.

Community Service

Over the years students at Our Lady's have been active in the community doing community service through projects like "Meals on Wheels", visiting the Nursing Home in Rupanyup each month and delivering Christmas biscuits to Murtoa's senior residents in December.

Working for Social Justice is also extremely important. The children have fundraised to support Caritas, Project Compassion, the School of St. Jude in Tanzania; Moira Kelly's "Children First" Foundation; Fr. Michael Malony's "Shared Table" project in Peru, as well as such charities as, The Cystic Fibrosis Foundation, the Epilepsy Foundation, the Royal Children's Hospital, The Royal Flying Doctors and the Cancer Council. **Sustainability and**

caring for the environment are always to the forefront of every day with water saving, energy saving, growing vegetables, planting trees with, "reduce, reuse, recycle" constantly being reinforced.


NEW INNOVATIONS IN THE CURRICULUM






